In 2015 - 2016, our students were able to work with some of these valued community partners:

PEI Council of People with Disabilities

The Council offers an essential skills program designed to assist individuals with disabilities to enhance their employability skills and career decision-making process in preparation for entry or re-entry into the workforce. Participants are involved in a program of Life Skills and Employability Training. Students have been involved in assisting participants with group activities along with developing and facilitating individual sessions.

Prince Edward Home and Beach Grove Home - Recreation Department

The Prince Edward Home is a 128-bed facility combining long-term care, under-60 care, and restorative/convalescent care. Beach Grove Home is a 132-bed nursing home facility for seniors who do not require acute general hospital care. In the past students have been linked with a resident and have planned and helped deliver activities that promote a good quality of life for residents, including residents living with dementia. They have also been involved in occasional home visits as part of the discharge planning process and wheelchair driving assessments.

• Fitzroy Centre Clubhouse, Canadian Mental Health Association

Fitzroy Centre Clubhouse is for individuals who have to deal with long-term mental health challenges and is designed to help members achieve a level of confidence that promotes productive and socially satisfying lives. Students have worked with the prevocational day program, where members and staff work side-by-side on a daily basis completing all the tasks necessary to operate the club.

• Queen Elizabeth Hospital - Youth Mental Health

The Queen Elizabeth Hospital is an acute care medical facility. The Psychiatry Unit provides in-patient mental health care for adults and youth. Students have worked with the social worker to organize small group sessions on topics such as goal setting, making positive decisions, developing oral communication skills.

• English Language School District and La Commission Scolaire de Langue Française

Students are placed with either a classroom teacher or resource teacher in various elementary, intermediate or secondary schools throughout the province. Students are engaged in or outside of the classroom doing small group or one-on-one activities with children who need support with their academic subjects or social/behavioural assistance.



Chances Family Resource Centre - Parent Education Program AND Best Start Program

Chance Family Resource Centre provide a range of child development and parent support services to children and their families, particularly those experiencing additional life challenges. They offer parent, family and child focused programming. Students are involved in a wide range of activities with Parent/Caregiver and Outreach sessions and the Best Start Home Visiting program.

• Brecken House Day Respite Program

This is a day program for seniors who are still living in the community, which provides a respite for caregivers. The program provides opportunities for entertainment, conversation, learning and health care promotion, but in more recent years the program has evolved to meet not only the increasing needs of seniors but those of their families as well. Field placement students spend much of their time interacting with the participants. They also develop and implement some program activities.
