

# History Majors Checklist

The following checklist is intended to assist students in determining which courses they need in order to meet the requirements for a degree in History. It is an informal document that is intended to supplement the Registrar's Audit.

## PREAMBLE: DECLARING A MAJOR

Before they can register as a major in History, a student must complete History 101/102 and six semester hours (2 courses) at the 200 level, and university regulations require that students declare a major (in something!) by the beginning of their third year. To declare a major in history does not require the approval of the History Department, although we would be happy to consult and advise. All a student need do to declare their major is to fill out the required form at the Registrar's Office.

## A. GENERAL DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

Please consult the calendar to ensure that you meet the **general UPEI requirements** for an Arts degree. These are the principal ones:

- 120 semester hours of credit \_\_\_\_\_
- Of the 42 semester hours required for a major, **at least 30** semester hours must be completed with grades of 60% or better \_\_\_\_\_
- At least one-half of the courses for a degree must be completed at UPEI \_\_\_\_\_
- In the last 60 semester hours of course work, **no more than 12** can be completed at a university other than UPEI \_\_\_\_\_
- Beginning in 2008-09, all graduating students must have **Global Issues 151** and **one other writing intensive course** \_\_\_\_\_
- Any student registered **before** 2008-09 must have English 101 and one other English course to graduate \_\_\_\_\_
- **No more than 48** semester hours of credit can be taken at the introductory level (except in Bachelor of Music) \_\_\_\_\_
- To graduate in the current academic year students must make formal application to graduate (which can be done on-line using your campus log-in) by 31 October of the academic year in which they expect to complete the requirements. \_\_\_\_\_
