



Residency / MVSc Program in Anatomic Pathology

The Department of Pathology and Microbiology, Atlantic Veterinary College (AVC), University of Prince Edward Island, is offering a three-year residency/graduate program in Anatomic Pathology. The first two years of the program will consist of residency training and completion of a non-thesis Master of Veterinary Science (MVSc) degree. If progress is deemed satisfactory, the resident will continue into a final year of training, gaining experience in our diagnostic laboratory primarily involving domestic farm and companion animal necropsy and surgical biopsy services.

The primary emphasis of this program is to provide the resident with diagnostic experience over a three year period to qualify for certification by the American College of Veterinary Pathologists (ACVP), with the graduate training strengthening critical thinking and research skills. Participation in the undergraduate pathology teaching program is required and publication of MVSc research and case reports is strongly encouraged.

Applicants must possess a DVM or equivalent qualification. Previous clinical experience is desirable but not required. Obtaining admission to the AVC graduate program will be a requirement for the successful candidate. The term of the appointment is August 1, 2019 to July 31, 2022. The salary is \$32,000 per annum. This position is subject to final budgetary approval.
