She has worked with the World Health Organization (WHO) where she dealt with the H1N1 pandemic, and the Haitian earthquake. We connect with youth through classroom and home school group visits. We also take requests from community groups (e.g., Scouts and Girl Guides), libraries, summer camps, after-school programs, and community festivals. We have a large database of ideas and instructions for many different activities, but we are always excited to hear new activity ideas too!

Another one of our goals is to promote volunteerism within the University, as well as the community at large. Volunteering with Let's Talk Science gives you some really great outreach experience, as well as an opportunity to meet and get to know other graduate (and undergraduate) students at UPEI!

The UPEI Rainbow Alliance, our campus' Gay-Straight Alliance, in partnership with many UPEI and community based organizations will be hosting a Day of Inclusion Awareness at UPEI on October 22nd.

This event will focus on the importance of including everyone, with an emphasis on LGBTQ, Accessibility/Disability and Cultural awareness. The day will be host to three main events, the Inclusion Fair, the Candlelight Vigil, and Diversity Trivia.

The inclusion fair will be hosted in MacMillan Hall inside the Student Centre (MSC), 11am-3pm, in which societies, student groups, companies, and organizations who promote diversity and inclusion will be participating. There will be information booths, games, and prizes for those who take part.

This year will also be the 6th Annual Candlelight Vigil against Homophobia, Bullying, and related Suicides. The Candlelight Vigil consists of guest speakers made up of many different backgrounds. In the past we have hosted students, community leaders, faculty/staff, high-school students, politicians, and anyone willing to take a stand against bullying/homophobia. The night is followed up with a candlelit moment of silent to give remembrance to those who have lost their lives to suicide/bullying. This event starts at 6pm and will be held in MacMillan Hall inside the Student Centre (MSC).

Finally the night will be finished off with Diversity Trivia hosted in the Wave (our campus pub) which will be hosted by GetReal UPEI, and the Student Diversity Office.
