Note: Degree Audit reports will NOT be accepted in lieu of transcripts. Your supervisor will fill out Part 2, then submit the completed application on-line to the NSERC Liaison Officer.
UPEI requirement	 You can pick only one supervisor and project. Consult the list that accompanies this poster to see who is eligible. Supervisors are limited to supporting two student applications. As part of the application process for UPEI, students are asked to write a letter indicating how they would benefit from the USRA. In the letter, they should demonstrate an understanding of the research project on which they will be working, and comment on how a USRA would further their career and professional objectives. Students should comment on any previous research experience, especially funded through the USRA program, and to discuss any contributions that may have arisen from this research. The letter must also describe the expected outcomes and outputs from the current research (e.g., report, poster, presentation, etc.).
