

2. RSF stories in UPEI's Campus Connector

UPEI produces a twice-monthly electronic newsletter called Campus Connector, which aggregates stories and press releases from the university. Campus Connector reaches more than 2,000 users from the campus community and beyond, including policy makers. The Research Communications Officer will submit two 250-300 word stories in 2017/18 about the technology, personnel, infrastructure, and programs supported by the RSF. The stories will convey the achievement of milestones and provide web links for further information on the impact of RSF at UPEI, and to the program itself. Content will include staff profiles and features on programs and infrastructure supported by RSF. (September 2017 and January 2018)

3. Social media

UPEI will push content from objectives 1 and 2 through its social media channels. Between Facebook and Twitter, this reaches more than 15,000 alumni, community members, and friends. (On going)

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
