This \$1,000 scholarship will be awarded to students who have applied and been accepted to participate in a minimum of one full academic semester abroad through the UPEI International Relations Office (IRO), and who have demonstrated an academic average of 75% or greater in all courses to date.

This is the first of its kind in the IRO and we are thrilled to be able to promote such a wonderful gift to our students. This scholarship will help offset the costs of an academic semester abroad.

Congratulations-Jultwahnique!

In the evolutionary ecology lab at UPEI, we ask questions about how plants interact with their environments, and try to understand some of the genetic factors associated with these interactions. For example, we might ask how warm and sunny climates affect plant growth and reproduction compared to cool environments, and how one species could be adapted to both environments. Because plants (and animals) do not recognize international boundaries, in order to address these questions our research must transcend the borders that often separate us. This means that we sample plants from the many places they grow, and we must collaborate with researchers who know the plant in the various climates we are interested in.

For the past two years, our lab has participated in an international research effort where undergraduate students design and run research that contributes to our knowledge of genotype by environment interactions. UPEI is the only Canadian institution involved in this research (13 institutions in total), and in our case we have been fortunate to also have a UPEI international student, Jultwahnique McDonald (Bahamas) involved in the work. Jultwahnique recently presented some of our work at a conference in St. John's, NL and was surprisingly one of the few undergraduate students at the conference! Way to go, Jultwahnique! In her own words (below), Jultwahnique describes some of this experience and the impact it has had on her. I have been working in Dr. Karen Samis' lab since 2014, first as a volunteer, then as a research assistant. Over the past two years, I have worked with several students who helped introduce me not only to research, but also to plant genetics research. It has been so inspiring to see how these students exude absolute excitement about their work - with plants! Before volunteering in the lab, my main goal was to attend medical school. Now, because of the exposure afforded to me, my choice of postundergraduate education is ecological research.

working with my lab mates and Karen, I have become savvy in the practices of proper research, but have also learned that it takes a lot of patience! I have made a few international friends, and have even participated in cross-border lab meetings discussing plant genetics with other students and faculty involved in the research. I wouldn't have guessed this when I first came to UPEI, but thanks to my involvement with this project, I now regularly find myself posting pictures of my cute plants on social media. Because this program allows for such hands-on exposure to research, I hope that it continues at UPEI." Regards,

New Markets-

Our international recruiters have been busy

As a result of intensive international recruitment activities and strategic planning by the International Relations Office, there is a significant increase of international applications for the 2016-17 academic year. Applications from high schools have doubled last year's number, and we are in the process of securing the conversion of the applications to actual registered students. Top source countries of international applications include Nigeria, China, Ghana, Bangladesh, the Caribbean region/countries, and the US. We also have a healthy number of applications from Mauritius, which is a brand new market for UPEI, but with strategic partnerships and planning, we are seeing a great return on our efforts. South America, Southeast

Asia and India are other emerging markets for us, and we are planning recruitment activities to these regions. China is still the largest source of international students for UPEL, as in cases of most Canadian universities, but competition is intense in China, and we have to diversify our strategy of recruitment in China. We are developing more short term, long term, and faculty exchange partnerships with strong Chinese partners, and we hope to continue the strong momentum and brand recognition in China. Japan is a market for more short-term programs, so is Korea. Jerry Wang

Visiting Lecturer and UPEI Ambassador

In conjunction with UPEI's International Relations Office, I had the good fortune in May of 2016 to be a visiting lecturer and UPEI ambassador at two of our highly regarded partner universities in China. Sichuan University has three beautiful campuses in the famous cultural and historic city of Chengdu, in the Sichuan province. It is one of China's key comprehensive research universities under the direct supervision of Ministry of Education, and offers programs in humanities, science, engineering, medicine, economy, management, law, history, philosophy, agriculture and education. The student body includes over 40,000 undergraduate and 20,000 graduate students. Chang'an University has five campuses and is located in the beautiful historical city of Xi'an, in the Shaanxi province. Xi'an (Western Peace), formerly Chang'an (Perpetual Peace), was the capital city for ten ancient imperial dynasties. The famous Bell Tower and Drum Tower reside inside the walls of the stunning "old city". Chang'an University is a comprehensive and influential institution of higher education known for its programs in

engineering, management, economics, and humanities. The current student body exceeds 31,000, including 9,000 graduate students. In addition to informal meetings with students, faculty, and staff, I had the opportunity to lecture on international business (with a focus on multinational tax strategies), and to present original research results on my corporate governance work on shareholder activism. During my visit, I was very impressed by the tremendous level of hospitality and engagement. Everyone I encountered was very welcoming and passionate about opportunities to further relationships with UPEI. The students were particularly interested in the "two-plustwo" program that UPEI has in place with both partners. Students accepted into this prestigious program complete their first two years at the "home" university in China, and then travel to Charlottetown for their final two years of undergraduate study. When they complete the program, students graduate with degrees from both the University of Prince Edward Island and their home institution. The program provides a great opportunity to hone English language skills, to experience a new culture, and to better prepare for graduate studies at a Western university.

My hosts were very generous in taking the time to introduce me to some of the fascinating aspects of their cities. In addition to enjoying the exceptional local cuisines, I was treated to an "insiders" look at the famous Terra Cotta Warriors and the Imperial Palace at the Huaqing Hot Springs near Xi'an, and the Chendu Research Base of Giant Panda Breeding

This summer, the EAP Program continues to welcome international high school and university students for short-term language programs. These programs help support the university's international reputation, aid in international recruitment efforts and raise the revenue profile. The groups attend English language classes in the mornings, taught by our EAP instructors and participate in fun and educational socio-cultural activities in the afternoons in and around PEI. They live with families from the UPEI Homestay Program. This summer we expanded our summer language program from three groups to five. The following groups have been or will be on campus this summer:

St. Hilda's High School – This is the 3rd summer that we've hosted students from this prestigious Anglican girls private high school from Tokyo, Japan.





Dankook University – This is the 6th time that students from our partner university have visited. They have experienced PEI in the summer and the winter.

Tsukuba University – This is the 3rd summer that we will host students from another partner university in Japan.

Meiji Gauken University – This is the first summer that we will host 10 students from the Economics department at Meiji Gauken University, Tokyo, Japan. These students will arrive mid-August for a 2 week introductory program and then attend EAP classes in the fall.



Tsukuba High School at Otsuka – This is the first time that we will be hosting 16 students from Otsuka, Japan.

This school has been selected by Japan's Ministry of Education to participate in the very prestigious "Super Global High School "Program.

These students will attend classes and activities for 2 weeks in August and study 2 very interesting subjects: Immigration trends in PEI and Coastal Erosion. Students will also have the opportunity to attend guest lectures with our very own UPEI Faculty: Dr. Godfrey Baldacchino, Dr. Adam Fenech, and Dr. Jim Randall.

The EAP Program is looking forward to welcoming new students into the both the EAP program and our Graduate EAP program (G-EAP).

With the increase in international applications, we are excited to see our numbers grow!
