

University of Tsukuba - Practical Information



Located about an hour by train from Tokyo, the University of Tsukuba is consistently ranked in Japan's top 10 universities. Approximately 7,500 of Tsukuba's 220,000 residents are from overseas, making the percentage of foreign residents one of the highest in the country.

The city of Tsukuba is home to around 40 research institutions, and was recently named as one of the four "International Strategic Zones" promoting green innovation with life science and technology. The Ibaraki prefecture, in which the city is located, is a traditional, rural area of Japan.

Insurance

It is essential to obtain travel insurance before coming to Japan. It is also compulsory to join Japan's National Health Insurance (NHI). The amount of the premium you must pay varies by city or ward. It is usually about 1,500 yen per month. Vehicle liability insurance is recommended, in case of accidents.
