A Year in Review

If three years under the spectre of COVID-19 wasn't oppressive enough for our students, they continued to demonstrate their resilience and strength of spirit through several interruptions to the 2022-2023 academic year: Hurricane Fiona, a 2-week break during the 2023 Canada Games, and a 4-week labour disruption.

While challenging for students and faculty alike, the past year also gave us many reasons to be thankful. New UPEI Performing Arts Centre Now Open

On January 27th, 2023, members of our faculty were pleased to give the inaugural performance at our brand new Performing Arts Centre, during an Open House for music industry leaders. This performance was also the first for our brand new Yamaha C7X piano which had arrived just the week before. The clear acoustics of the 400-seat amphitheatre, along with its spacious stage, provides our large ensembles and other artistic organizations in the community with a fantastic new performance space. The backstage area is replete with a small rehearsal room, two large dressing rooms, and storage space. The construction of this new venue has been made possible by donors who have contributed to UPEI's \$3 million Performing Arts fundraising initiative (see more details on page 13).

A portion of the money raised through the above-mentioned fundraising campaign has been designated for much-needed renovations of the Dr. Steel Recital Hall, which began on May 2nd, 2023. Performers and audiences alike can look forward to new stage flooring, seating, window treatments, lighting, painting, washrooms, entrance doors, better accessibility, and control booth upgrades. It is anticipated to be completed by late August 2023, just in time for the new academic year.

PEI Symphony Orchestra guest soloists

Noah Malcolm (Class of 2012) was one of five local singer-songwriters featured in the PEISO's Emerging Artist Spotlight Series of videos (available on YouTube). In his video, which launched the series on March 3rd, Noah performed two original songs accompanied by the PEI Symphony Orchestra, with Dr. Karem Simon conducting. Orchestrations for this project were created by Natalie Williams Calhoun (director of the UPEI String Orchestra).



Two of our alumni, mezzo-sopranos Jillian Clow and Hannah O'Donnell (both from the Class of 2015), were featured soloists with the PEI Symphony Orchestra on March 5th, 2023. Conducted by Dr. Karem Simon, the program featured renditions of works for voice and orchestra by Berlioz, Whitacre, Rossini, and Offenbach, which were very well received by the large audience in attendance.

UPEI Wind Symphony Alumni Reunion

From December 27th to 29th, 2022, over 60 former members of the UPEI Wind Symphony came together for a three-day reunion to reconnect and rehearse, culminating in a public performance on the 29th at Dr. Steel Recital Hall, conducted by Dr. Karem Simon.







Participating alumni represented graduating classes from 1972 to 2022 – a 50-year timespan covering the entire existence of UPEI. It was a remarkable concert, three years in the making, which included an eclectic mix of traditional and contemporary wind band music featuring some of the treasured pieces from the repertoire.

Of special note were the performances of "Skyline" by Evan Hammell, an emerging composer and former UPEI music student who completed his degree in composition at the University of Toronto, and of "Goodnight Moon" with mezzo-soprano Alexandra Sorensen (Class of 2022) as the featured soloist.

Bravo to all for a musically and artistically rewarding performance which was both an endorsement of the UPEI Music brand and a celebration of the immense expertise and capability of our graduates.

Faculty Achievements

Prof. Sung Ha Shin-Bouey

This year, Sung Ha directed two wonderful choral concerts – one in December and one in April – featuring the UPEI Concert Choir, UPEI Chamber Singers, UPEI SSA Ensemble, and vocal soloists from her and Stephen Bouey's studios. Collaborators included pianists Leo Marchildon and Morgan Saulnier, and cellist Natalie Williams Calhoun.

Sung Ha herself performed as a soloist on the March 19th Faculty Recital, in collaboration with pianist Magdalena von Eccher, flutist Morgan Saulnier, and cellist Natalie Williams Calhoun.

In the Spring 2022 issue of this newsletter, we shared a story about how the UPEI Chamber Singers, under the direction of Sung Ha Shin-Bouey, were selected to perform a chorus in an innovative nation-wide digital production of Handel's *Messiah*. Produced by Against the Grain Theatre in collaboration with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, the *Messiah/Complex* video and digital album continues to receive international critical acclaim, and has been



featured by The New York Times, BBC World Service, BBC Today Programme, France Musique, The Los Angeles Times, Boston Globe, and Opera Wire, which called it "A Revolutionary Approach to Handel's Masterpiece." In Canada, it was showcased by CBC's The National, CBC q, The Globe and Mail, Toronto Star, Xtra, Broadview, Opera Canada, Maclean's, and LudwigVan.com, where critic Paula Citron described this version of *Messiah* as "one of the single greatest accomplishments in the annals of Canadian classical music."



On November 7th, 2022, New York-based OPERA America announced that *Messiah/Complex* was the winner of the "Noteworthy Project" award at the inaugural OPERA America Awards for Digital Excellence in Opera, recognizing the best work created for digital platforms by individual producers and organizations across North America. The 2022 winners were selected from over 100 submissions and only 14 finalists.

It is a significant accomplishment for Sung Ha and her Chamber Singers to have been included in this amazing production, which brings attention to our small department from all over the world.

Dr. Karem J. Simon

During a productive sabbatical this past year, Karem presented a number of recitals across PEI in both Fall and Winter terms. These recitals featured a variety of exciting repertoire for clarinet with piano and/or strings, performed with Magdalena von Eccher and members of the Atlantic String Machine.

In addition, Karem conducted the PEI Symphony Orchestra for their Emerging Artist Spotlight Series of videos released throughout the spring on YouTube, and guest conducted a regular season concert on March 5th with a program of beloved chamber orchestra repertoire. Karem also organized and directed the UPEI Wind Symphony Alumni Reunion concert in December.

Karem's solo album, "Solitary Clarinet", was released in November 2022. A collection of thirteen pieces for clarinet alone, the album includes some of Karem's favourite clarinet monologues – character pieces, meditations, songs without words, dances without movement. Spanning three centuries, these works encompass transcriptions, staples of the clarinet repertoire, etudes, and contemporary compositions. The album is available online and on your favourite streaming services. Physical CDs are available for purchase in the main office at the UPEI Music Department.





As he prepares to retire on August 31st, we congratulate Dr. Karem J. Simon on his appointment to the title of Professor Emeritus at the 2023 Convocation for the Faculty of Arts on May 18th. Such an appointment is approved by Senate after a rigorous nomination process, and only Full Professors who have demonstrated superior achievements are eligible. It is a fitting culmination to this chapter in Dr. Simon's distinguished career.

Dr. Dale Sorensen

After three years at UPEI on successive term contracts, Dale was appointed to a tenure-track position beginning on July 1st, 2022. Coincidentally, Karem Simon began his sabbatical on this date, and Dale dived in to serve as Acting Chair of the Music Department for this academic year.

In addition to his teaching and administrative duties, Dale maintained a busy performance schedule with the Charlottetown Festival Orchestra (summer 2022), PEI Symphony Orchestra, Symphony Nova Scotia, and the Maritime Brass Quintet.

As a soloist who is passionate about commissioning new music for trombone by Canadian composers, Dale gave two world premiere performances this past year. Commissioned with the support of the Canada Council for the Arts, Kelly Marie Murphy's And the Sun Brought Darkness for trombone and piano, was premiered by Dale on May 31st, 2022, at the annual MusCan Conference at Acadia University in Wolfville, NS. On April 24th, 2023, Dale premiered Roger F. Taylor's Concerto for Trombone, Strings and Percussion with Nova Sinfonia in Halifax, NS.



On June 1st, 2023, Dale began a new 3-year term as Chair of the department. We wish him the best in this role!



Dr. Magdalena von Eccher

Magdalena was also appointed to a tenure-track position beginning on July 1st, 2022, after three years on term contracts. Magdalena's piano studio continues to grow, notably through attracting several international students to UPEI. This year, Magdalena performed recitals with Karem Simon and Nicole Strum, adjudicated at two music festivals in Nova Scotia, and gave piano workshops and masterclasses through the PEI Registered Music Teachers' Association.

On May 19th, 2023, at a Member Celebration Evening of the UPEI Faculty Association, Magdalena received a 2022-2023 Hessian Merit Award for Excellence in Teaching, which honours UPEI faculty members who are recognized as possessing outstanding competence in teaching. In the citation read at the ceremony, Magdalena was described as "an elite musician, masterful performer, and outstanding teacher." The testimony given by the three students who nominated Magdalena for the award describes a teacher who excels at creating "an environment that celebrates individuality, inclusivity and equity, welcomes and supports each person, [and ensures] their success academically, socially, and culturally." Congratulations, Magdalena!

Dr. Andrew Zinck

During UPEI's Awards of Excellence ceremony on May 25th, 2023, Andrew was deservedly recognized with a University Teaching Excellence Award. This award recognizes outstanding contributions to teaching in one or more areas, including teaching effectiveness, teaching innovation, scholarship of teaching and learning, and educational leadership. Andrew has amassed an extraordinary resume of pedagogical innovations, which our students experience on a regular basis and, through his many publications, benefit the wider teaching community.

Andrew has also received a promotion to the rank of Full Professor, effective July 1st, 2023. To say that the promotion process is rigorous would be an understatement! An application for promotion must first be approved by a Department Review Committee, following which it must receive the approval of the appropriate Dean, the University Review Committee, the University President, and finally the Board of Governors. Congratulations, Andrew!


