## Additional General Requirements

- Must complete at least 14 Psychology courses (including the four core courses).
- Must complete one of the following courses: UPEI 1010, UPEI 1020, or UPEI 1030
- Must complete a second writing intensive course (strongly recommend UPEI 1010, formerly English 101)
- Must NOT have more than 16 introductory-level courses (Note: Psychology 100S [no longer offered] and University 100 each count as two courses).
- Must pass at least 10 Psychology courses with grades of at least 60%.
- Must complete half of courses required for degree at UPEI (exceptions approved by Dean only).
- Must not have more than 4 courses, in the last 20, from outside UPEI (exceptions approved by Dean only).
- To graduate with a BA or BSc, must have credit for 40 courses (University 100, Psychology 100, and Arts 400 each is equivalent to two courses).
- Please note: those intending to graduate with Honours in Psychology must have credit for 42 courses (126 semester hours), one of which must be PSY4810 (Origins and Contexts of Psychological Thought and Practice). Also note that Psychology 4800 and 4900 count for 4 of the 42 course total (i.e. 6 semester hours each).

## II. General Requirements for BSc
