

2025 Graduate Student Scholarship Department of Pathology & Microbiology

The Department of Pathology & Microbiology at the Atlantic Veterinary College (AVC) is currently holding a Graduate Student Scholarship Competition. The scholarship will provide a minimum stipend of \$32,000/annum. The award will be given to an exceptional candidate who is starting their graduate degree at AVC as early as May 1, 2025.

Canadian and International students holding a BSc, MSc or DVM (or equivalent) credentials with strong academic records and relevant background experience are encouraged to apply. Candidates will be selected based on prior academic performance and future promise as a researcher. The successful candidate must meet the AVC graduate admission requirements and must be able to identify a suitable program that is currently available at AVC.

Prior to submitting their application, applicants are required to contact faculty members to identify a potential supervisor willing to support their program.
