Top Transferable Skills

Intercultural awareness: Understand both your own and other cultures, and the similarities and differences between them, which may be connected to values, beliefs, and/or behaviour.

Communication: Actively listen, give and receive critical feedback, be empathetic and pay attention to body language to help effectively communicate ideas to others - adapting communication style when necessary.



Top Transferable Skills

Conflict resolution: Apply critical and analytical skills to the real world to navigate issues arising from multiple and conflicting interpretations of texts and traditions with sensitivity and empathy.

Critical thinking: Take into consideration different viewpoints, logic, and philosophies from an interdisciplinary perspective. Identify, analyze and solve problems systematically, engage in reflective and independent thinking, and rigorously question ideas and assumptions rather than accepting them.
