Processing Recommendations

- Application folders to be returned to the Registrar’s Office via an admissions memorandum to gradmemos@upei.ca no later than 3 weeks after they have been received. New application folders may be withheld if there are outstanding files with the committee; this is to ensure applicants are getting a response in a timely manner.
- Admission memorandums are required for all applicants (including rejected applicants). The admissions decision field on the memorandum is shared with rejected applicants, please ensure that reasoning is filled out and concise.
- If a program area has repeatedly changed (extended) their application date or deadline that they look into making a formal change to the deadline, as this allows for a more fair application process for all applicants
- Documentation deadline for supplemental application documentation is something some programs have moved toward and seems to be more clear and concise for applicants. We would recommend that all program areas move toward this model
- Deans are not permitted to waive published admission requirements, if there is a specific requirement that is found to be questioned or “waived” frequently we ask again that a formal change to the programs admissions requirements are considered (ie English levels, GRE requirements, GPAs)
 - If a temporary change to admission requirements is needed it must be applied to ALL applicants in that cohort
 - Applications that become complete late and that are sent to committee 6 weeks or less prior to the program start date should be reviewed and sent back to the registrar’s office as soon as possible. This allows for a smoother process for the student and avoids issues in areas such as registration, timetabling, and accounting
- It is extremely important from a recruitment standpoint that coordinators and/or potential supervisors respond to students in a timely manner to ensure the student experience is positive and that they get the information they are inquiring about so they move forward with their application. If inquiries are received that are out of your scope please forward applicants to contact studentsupport@upei.ca, these emails are fielded and forwarded to correct area
 - If a program area only has so many allotted spots or available supervisors the Registrar’s Office should be notified if these become full prior to the deadline so that the application can be removed to avoid new applications coming in. The website should also be updated.
 - Duolingo will be offered as a English proficiency test to some graduate applicants at the discretion of the Registrar’s Office during the pandemic. If there are applicants inquiring about duolingo please have them contact the Registrar’s Office as we have recently changed minimum requirements on this test. (Applicants are now required to score 120 in each category to obtain a clear offer pertaining to English using the Duolingo Test)

- A formal deferral process will be put forth in the upcoming calendar that will apply to all graduate programs
- Program areas are responsible for their own website and ensuring their information is up to date with the current academic calendar
