



## WHERE TO FIND YOUR IMMUNIZATION RECORDS

Contact your parent(s)/guardian(s), public health agencies where you grew up, family physician, or health care providers.

### **If You Received Vaccinations *in PEI***

- Public Health Nursing offices can provide vaccine records administered through PEI Public Health Nursing at no cost. Processing may take approximately two weeks.
- [MyHealthPEI](#) allows access to immunization history, laboratory results, and diagnostic imaging reports. Immunization records are available for PEI residents born in 1998 or later.
- Students may email their request for records of vaccines received through the Health and Wellness Centre to [healthcentre@upei.ca](mailto:healthcentre@upei.ca).

### **If You Received Vaccinations *Outside PEI***

- Check with your province, territory, or country of residence. Records may be available through ministries of health, public health offices, family physicians, or immunization registries.

### **Important Notes:**

- Often, students assume that immunization records are unavailable. In many cases, parents or guardians may still have copies of childhood records that can be helpful in completing this process.
- **Without written documentation, immunizations may need to be repeated.**
- Individuals without any records may require up to 10 immunizations/injections over approximately 7–14 months.
  - If this applies to you, it is essential that you **contact your faculty's program coordinator ASAP** so they can support you through this process.
