Lévesque Graduate Fellowship in Nutrisciences and Health

BACKGROUND

J.-Louis Lévesque graduated with a B.A. from Saint Dunstan's University (SDU) in 1934 and was granted an honorary doctor of laws degree by SDU in 1964. Through a generous endowment from the Fondation J.-Louis Lévesque, UPEI founded the Jeanne and J.-Louis Lévesque Fund for Nutrisciences and Health and has established the Lévesque Research Chair, the Lévesque Research Professorships, and the Lévesque Graduate Fellowships.

CRITERIA

This fellowship will be granted to a Graduate (Master or PhD) student registered at UPEI in the upcoming academic year and engaged in the areas of nutrisciences and health research. Applications will be assessed on the following:

- Quality of the proposed research program
- Opportunity for the applicant to conduct meaningful research in a UPEI laboratory with a designated supervisor
- Academic standing

Note: Research in nutrisciences is broadly defined as research that focuses on the role natural compounds play in a variety of areas including neurological disorders, obesity-related disorders, as well as infection and immunity in humans and animals. Research in health is broadly defined as research that focuses on finding ways to prevent and treat disease.

For applications to be considered there must be a nutrition/nutrient/bioactive compound component to the research and it must be clearly stated.

APPLICATION PROCESS (Deadline: October 1)

Recipients may receive one Levesque Fellowship in each of their Masters and PhD program(s), to a maximum of two fellowships per student.
