- Dr. Peter and Donna Meincke Alumni Scholarship**—full-time student scheduled to graduate (4th year); based on academics and financial need
- Earl F. Nicholson Alumni Scholarship**—full-time student scheduled to graduate (4th year); based on academics and financial need
- Bill Ledwell Alumni Scholarship**—full-time student scheduled to graduate (4th year); based on academics and financial need
- H.Wade MacLauchlan Scholarship**—renewable, for returning (3rd year) student; based on academics and financial need
- Constable Bernard Mullally Bursary**—full-time student; based on financial need
- PEI Literacy Alliance (William J. Hancock Bursary)**—mature student who has conquered literacy challenges in the past

ARTS

- John and Elsie Cuthbertson Memorial Music Bursary**—full-time music student; based on financial need; preference given to a voice student who is a Canadian citizen
- D.A. Murchison Memorial Scholarship in Music**—returning student in the Music program who is in good academic standing and has displayed extraordinary volunteerism and leadership on campus and in the greater community
- Dr. Elaine Harrison Award**—2nd-, 3rd-, and 4th-year, full-time student who is talented and in financial need
- Winifred Paton Award**—2nd-, 3rd-, and 4th-year, full-time student who is talented and in financial need

BUSINESS

- The William Van Rooyen Sr. Memorial Bursary**—student entering 3rd- or 4th-year business who is specializing in accounting and intends to enter the chartered accounting profession; financial need; and an agricultural background will be given preference
- D.A. Murchison Memorial Scholarship in Business**—entering 3rd- or 4th-year business in good academic standing and has displayed extraordinary volunteerism and leadership on campus and in the greater community

EDUCATION

- The Irene D. Wyand Memorial Bursaries**—awarded to students enrolled in the BEd program who attended a PEI high school and are completing an international teaching placement in that academic year

NURSING

- Margaret (Griffin) Mullen Bursary**—a 2nd-year, full-time, Island student who is a single parent (male or female) and in financial need
- Charlottetown Hospital Nurses' Alumnae Bursary**—an alumna from the Charlottetown Hospital School of Nursing pursuing post-RN studies, or a child of an alumnae enrolled in the bachelor of nursing program. If no alumnae or their children eligible, award will go to a nursing student entering 4th year at UPEI
- Alumnae Association of the PEI Hospital School of Nursing**—4th-year nursing student; based on financial need and not in receipt of any other financial assistance at or above \$500
- Sister Mary Gabriel Bursaries**—Island students; based on academics and financial need
- The Adele Gardiner Nursing Bursary (Prince County Hospital Auxiliary)**—2nd-, 3rd-, and 4th-year Island student from Prince County, or nursing student who received high school education in Prince County; based on academics and financial need
- Dr. Margaret F. Munro Entrance Bursary for Nursing**—1st-year student entering UPEI School of Nursing; based on financial need
- Joan Millar Entrance Scholarship for Nursing Students**—full-time student entering the UPEI School of Nursing; applicants who have a licensed practical nursing (LPN) designation or who have children will receive preference
- The Alumnae Association of the PEI Hospital School of Nursing Class of 1960 Bursary**—3rd-year nursing student who displays excellent bedside nursing skills, is in good academic standing, and financial need
- C. Jean (Ross) MacKay, RN Nursing Scholarship**—awarded to a returning nursing student who intends to pursue an international experience as part of their UPEI education
- Andrews of PEI Nursing Award**—3rd- or 4th-year student enrolled full-time in the nursing program or a 1st- or 2nd-year full-time student in accelerated nursing who intends to pursue a nursing degree in the geriatric field

SCIENCE

- The Marguerite Jobe Maloney Award in Family & Nutritional Sciences**—returning foods & nutrition student pursuing his/her education in the face of obstacles such as physical, financial, family, or social
- PEI Advisory Council on the Status of Women Engineering Bursary**—female engineering student entering 3rd year, who maintains a passing average and is in financial need

- Metro Credit Union Scholarship**—returning student who has declared a minor in environmental studies, in good academic standing, and has demonstrated a commitment to service and social responsibility in his/her community
- Flora Murchison Memorial Scholarship in Applied Human Sciences**—returning student majoring in Foods & Nutrition or Family Science in good academic standing and has displayed extraordinary volunteerism and leadership on campus and in the greater community

OTHER (Note: The following bursaries/scholarships have specific eligibility requirements)

- Austin A. Scales Scholarships**—rural students from Prince Edward Island in their 2nd year of studies (one for each of the three counties of the province); based on academics and financial need
- Provincial IODE Scholarship**—Island resident in 2nd year; graduate of a PEI high school; based first, on academics and second, on financial need
- Dr. Albert Bing Ching Young Memorial Scholarship**—Island resident who has attended an Island high school and is entering the first year of full-time studies at UPEI; academics and financial need are major considerations; not available to students already on scholarship
- Senator Elsie Inman Memorial Scholarship**—Island resident who has completed at least one year at UPEI and is registered in a program designed to enable him/her to work in an agriculture-related field and intending to pursue that career on PEI
- Zonta Club of Charlottetown 40th Anniversary Single Mother Bursary**—single mother in financial need and attending UPEI on a full-time basis
- MAPUS Bursaries**—part-time mature students in financial need
- Lloyd B. MacDonald Memorial Bursary**—male student in financial need
- PEI Service Memorial Scholarship**—awarded annually to a student who is a PEI resident who serves/served, or has ancestors or family members who served, in the Canadian Armed Forces, Royal Canadian Navy, Canadian Army, Royal Canadian Air Force, Royal Canadian Sea, Army, or Air Cadets
- The Dr. John H. Maloney Scholarship**—for an undergraduate student in business or science who has expressed inquisitiveness and desire to learn; shows leadership; is a team player; contributes to UPEI or the general community in a meaningful manner; and in financial need
- The J. Elmer Hynes Aboriginal Student Achievement Award**—for an aboriginal student who distinguishes himself or herself through leadership, commitment and academic accomplishment; must be a Canadian-born aboriginal student
- The UPEI Adult Education Award**—for an adult learner (an individual who has been out of high school at least seven years) studying part-time toward a degree, diploma, or certificate and has identifiable community service through volunteerism and has financial need; applicants must have completed two courses in the previous year
- The Association of Community Living “Ruby Smallman and Rossie Pierce” Awards**—awarded to two students with intellectual disabilities who access the supports offered through UPEI’s Accessibility Services
- Captain Nichola K.S. Goddard Scholarship**—student who is engaged in a project with a focus on issues relevant to indigenous peoples, whether in Canada or internationally. The project should be for academic credit at UPEI. Student’s proposal should include a description of project and timeline
- Dr. Barbara R. Campbell Inspiration Award**—returning student who is a single parent in good academic standing with preference given to a student who has demonstrated volunteerism on campus and/or community, intends to pursue an international experience as part of his/her UPEI education, and/or desires to become a global citizen
- Moonlight Scholarship**—returning student in good academic standing who has expressed an interest in the Buddhist faith as evidenced by successful completion of one or more of the following: Religious Studies 102, 221, 251, 261 or 352 and is not in receipt of other scholarships greater than \$5,000 per semester
