

Application of Academic Regulation 1(k)

From the University Calendar, Undergraduate Academic Regulation 1(k) states:

Double-counting is the practice of having one course satisfy the requirements of two different and concurrent designations within one degree. The following limitations apply: In the case of a major and a minor, a maximum of six semester hours of credit can be double-counted. In the case of a double major, a maximum of nine semester hours of credit can be double-counted. Note: Although a course may be used to meet more than one requirement within a degree, credit is only counted once.

For each major within SMCS, the School has determined a list of major courses (minimum 42 credit hours) to be used in the application of the above regulation. Thus for any specific major, the courses on that major's list may only be double-counted with at most six semester hours of credit from a minor or at most nine semester hours of credit from another major. The lists for the SMCS majors are given on the accompanying sheet.
